COBA is an official affiliate of the Ontario Baseball Association ("OBA"), which is the official governing body for baseball in the province of Ontario, and recognized as such by Baseball Canada.

A's 2015 Program Focus

The Oakville A's Rep baseball program will deliver an **elite baseball** development program for players ranging in age from 7 to 21. As outlined in our Rep Manual, elite is defined by the:

- 1. Quality and depth of baseball coaching provided,
- 2. Opportunity to train year round,
- 3. Ability to compete against the best,
- 4. Opportunity to develop in a competitive and supportive environment,
- 5. Exposure received by a player to showcase their talent.

The outcome of our **elite baseball** development program will be to maximize the talent and opportunity for each of our Rep baseball players. We strive to provide the best baseball environment available to an Oakville based ball player.

In 2015 we are specifically targeting to improve our overall programming by:

- A. Adding the ability to train year round at our own indoor training centre.
- B. Creating a connection between cohort teams and between all A's teams each A's player and coach is part of something much bigger.
- C. Providing better A's Rep leadership visibility. You will see members of the Rep Committee out at our diamonds.





A's Player Streams

Baseball Oakville has an integrated program at each cohort that starts at House League and finishes at Tier 1. The Rep program will have two streams Tier 1 and Tier 2. Historically Tier 1 has been called AAA and Tier 2, AA.

Tier 1 is Baseball Oakville's highest level of competition. **Playing at this level is a commitment.** Players aspiring to play AAA have made a decision to invest in themselves to maximize their talent and see where it will take them.

Tier 2 is our feeder team to our Tier 1 club. As a cohort moves through the eleven (11) age series, a player's talent matures and skill sets develop. Today's Rookie Ball Tier 2 player is likely a Tier 1 player at Peewee or Bantam. To meet that upward movement of talent, Tier 2 will heavily emphasize individual player development, including a greater exposure to positions.

MEL Minor Midget A's

In June 2014, Baseball Ontario announced that four of its affiliated associations (Central Ontario Baseball Association, Hamilton District Baseball Association, Toronto Baseball Association and the York-Simcoe Baseball Association) had signed an agreement to form a new Midget Elite League (MEL) commencing with the 2015 playing season. The MEL agreement allows Minor or Major Midget aged players within the four affiliated associations to try-out for any of the new MEL teams, without the need for a player release.

The Oakville Minor Baseball Association (OMBA or Baseball Oakville) is proud to announce the commencement of a new MEL Minor Midget team starting this fall and a MEL Midget team in the fall of 2015.

Tyler Moe (T: (416) 580-1240, E: tylermoe@ymail.com) has been appointed the head coach of the Oakville A's MEL Minor Midget team and brings with him his extensive baseball background and experience. Tyler is currently employed by the Major League Baseball's Baltimore Orioles as an Area Scout in Canada. Earlier this year he was named as a member of the Top 100 Most Influential Canadians in Major League Baseball by Bob Elliott of the Canadian Baseball Network.

Indoor Training Facility

Set to open in October 2014, Baseball Oakville is proud to announce its new 10,700 square foot Indoor Training facility, which is set to become the cornerstone for player training and development in Oakville.

Centrally located at 2270 Speers Road in Oakville, the new facility will provide players with access to the year round training with highly experienced coaches in a professional setting, that they are looking for to take their game to the next level.

Corbetts Source for Sports in Oakville - https://corbetts.sourceforsports.com/ - has been chosen as Baseball Oakville's indoor training facility partner. Corbetts has been a long time supplier to Baseball Oakville and has stepped up to provide all of the facility's required training equipment. Vendors participating in outfitting our facility through Corbetts include Rawlings, Worth and Jugs.

Baseball Oakville will announce in September 2014 a full list of corporate sponsors who have graciously provided cash contributions to fund the purchase the turf for the indoor training facility.

Key features of the facility include:

- All training areas to be fully turfed.
- 5,000 square feet (50'x100') of fully turfed open space for fielding and skills training, featuring 22 foot plus ceiling height.
- Multiple full length hitting tunnels featuring Jugs pitching machines.
- Pitching areas featuring both portable and clay mounds.
- Parent viewing area.





A's Head Coach Selection

The hiring of all Tier 1 Head Coaches will be completed by the Rep Committee and approved by the Board of Directors before Labour Day. Tier 1 Head Coaches will be hired under a 2-year agreement and will be held to specific metrics during the term of the agreement.

A Tier 1 head coach will lead the cohort and work with the Tier 2 head coach to develop a consistent training and development philosophy for all players. Also, the Tier 1 head coach will work with the Rep Committee to select the Tier 2 coach after the Tier 1 team is selected.
